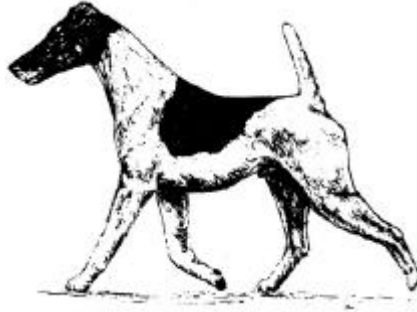

SBKC 2008 Judges Biographies

Larry and Pauline Andrus Larry and Pauline's life in purebred dogs began in the early 1960s when they adopted a rather unruly Irish Setter. A friend thought that an obedience class might help. They acquired more four more Irish Setters and then entered the world of the Golden Retrievers of which at one time they had as many as 13 that they were training and exhibiting in both obedience and conformation. They presently have four dogs of which they are showing two: and Australian Shepherd and a Golden. They started judging about 35 years ago and are approved for all Obedience and Rally.

Gretchen Bernardi Gretchen, a member of Santa Barbara Kennel Club, acquired her first Irish Wolfhound in 1969 but did not commence breeding until 1977. Over the years, she has been involved with all breed clubs, Sighthound clubs, humane and wildlife organizations. In 1990, she was appointed by the Governor of the state of Illinois to be the canine representative on the Livestock Advisory Commission, a position that she still holds. Over the years, she has written for many dog publications and she currently is a monthly columnist for the Canine Chronicle. At her farm in Illinois, she has hosted the Locust Grove Irish Wolfhound Association match for the last 29 years, attracting up to 150 Wolfhounds from across the United States and Canada, to show under top Wolfhound and Sighthound judges from around the world.

Rita Biddle Her start in dogs was in the 1960s with Great Danes and in the eighties, Akitas entered her life, both of which she bred and exhibited under the O'Ryan prefix. She now has only Akitas. She began judging at the championship level in 1993 and is presently approved to judge the Hound and Working Groups and various other breeds.

Edd Bivin Edd first judged at Santa Barbara Kennel Club in the early 1970s and has returned many times. We are pleased to have him back again. He acquired his first dog at the age of twelve; a Pomeranian bitch that started a breeding program that produced top-winning Pomeranians. He judged his first match at the age of fifteen and in 1961 was approved by the American Kennel Club to judge Pomeranians at championship point shows making him one of, if not the youngest, to ever be approved to judge in this country. At present, he is approved to judge five groups and various other breeds. Along with his wife, Irene, he now breeds and exhibits Doberman Pinschers.

Robert Black Robert's life-long passion is Terriers. Hew obtained his first Westie in the late 1960s and has been an active breeder and exhibitor ever since. Now he devotes his time to breeding and exhibiting Lakeland Terriers. He started his judging career 6 years ago.

Michael Buckley Mike, a member of Santa Barbara Kennel Club, resides in New Hampshire with his family and the Buckleigh Smooth Fox Terriers over 60 of which have become Champions, many of them becoming Show, Group and Best in Speciaoty winners. He obtained his first Smooth in 1966 while a freshman in high school and became involved in both breed and junior handling. At this time, he also showed Skye Terriers.

Reinaldo Burgos Rey began in the sport of dogs in 1962. He has shown, bred and finished many Chihuahuas, Miniature Pinschers and Yorkshire Terriers. He is involved in many breed and all-breed clubs and judges the Toy and Non-Sporting groups.

Deborah Cabe Debbie first became involved in Obedience at the age of ten with her first dog, a Standard Poodle. In 1982, she bought her first Rottweiler with which she obtained a Utility title. She obtained her first conformation Rottweiler in 1988. In addition to Conformation and

Obedience she has also done therapy work with her dogs. She has bred 11 Champions in her four litters.

Mary Jane Carberry Mary Jane has been "in dogs" all of her life having been brought up with Wire Fox Terriers. She attended her first dog show at the age of eight. After college, she began to show her own Airedales and Welsh Terriers in both conformation and obedience. She handled professionally for about 15 years specializing in Terriers. From 1997 until 2005 when she began judging she worked as a Superintendent.

Betsy Dale After nearly 20 years of breeding and showing Airedales, Betsy started judging in 1984. Since that time she has also been involved in Welsh Terriers, Scottish Terriers and Brussels Griffons. She is approved to judge all Terriers, Non-Sporting and many Toy breeds.

E. Katie Gammill Katie and her husband reside at Indian Creek Farms in Lerna, Illinois where they have bred Australian Cattle Dogs, Shetland Sheepdogs and Quarter Horses since 1957. She has also been involved in the Whippet breed. Since 1979, she has given seminars on Form and Function which is a non-breed specific program that teaches guidelines for analyzing standards and correctness.

Sue Goldberg Sue has been involved with Soft Coated Wheaten Terriers since 1968 and has produced 67 champions to date under the Wheatens of Shandalee banner. Her dogs have earned title in conformation, obedience, canine good citizenship, agility and herding, and several are certified therapy dogs. She served on the Soft Coated Wheaten Terrier Club of America Standard Revision Committee that wrote the breed standard that is in effect today. Sue is presently approved to judge all Sporting and Terriers plus Poodles, Bichons and PBGVs.

Carl E. Gomes Carl has been involved in the sport of dogs since he was a teenager when he acquired a Boston Terrier and a German Shepherd. He started showing in 1968 and started handling professionally in 1973. He is now the Chairman of Judges Education for the Boston Terrier Club of America.

Marjorie Martorella Marjorie began in dogs in 1966 with an Irish Setter. In 1968, she acquired her first Pointer and has not been without one since. She breeds under the Marjetta prefix and has produced approximately 140 Pointer Champions as well as 8 Best in Show winners and a National Specialty Winner. In 1994, she entered into the English Cocker breed, specializing in solid colors of English and European bloodlines. She is approved to judge the Sporting, Hound and Working Groups as well as several of the Non-Sporting breeds.

Kimberly Anne Meredith-Cavanna Kimberly, a member of Santa Barbara Kennel Club, has been continuously involved in the sport of purebred dogs since 1970 and over the years has owned not only Alaskan Malamutes but also Akitas, Bernese Mountain Dogs, Dobermans, Lhasa Apsos and a Clumber Spaniel. As a breeder-handler of Alaskan Malamutes, she has bred or owned over 50 Champions, including National Specialty winners, multiple group winners, Best in Show winners and working weight pull and sledding titled dogs.

Jan Paulk Jan grew up with purebred Cocker Spaniels and channeled her childhood desire to become a veterinarian into the sport of exhibiting dogs. In 1971, her first show dog was a German Shepherd. In 1976, she moved to Papillons. Following retirement from her political and diplomatic career in 1999, she moved from Washington, DC to Santa Fe, NM and began her judging career. She shares her home with 2 Anatolian Shepherds and 5 Papillons.

Laurent Pichard Laurent began his breeding program in 1972 with American Cocker Spaniels. Overall he has bred more than 250 Champions including World, International and AKC Champions. He considers one of his greatest wins to be the win of his American Cocker, Ch. Very Vigie Vamos a la Playa, against top dogs from all over the world at the first Eukanuba World Challenge Competition held in conjunction with the AKC- Eukanuba Invitational in Long Beach in 2007. Laurent began his judging career in 1980 and presently is licensed to judge FCI Groups I, III, VII, VIII and IX (roughly corresponding to AKC Herding, Working, Sporting and Toy Groups) plus various individual breeds. He also breeds English Cockers and Weimaraners. To see his very impressive web-site go to www.veryvigie.com.

Carol Reisman Carol, a member of Santa Barbara Kennel Club, is a native New Yorker who was born and raised on Long Island's South Shore. In 1967, she brought home her first Afghan Hound which was the beginning of a 40+ year commitment to the sport of dogs. After winning the Afghan Hound Club of America's Specialty in 1979, jCarol "cut the show lead" and began judging. She is presently owned by the ubiquitous "Roxie", a Miniature Wirehaired Dachshund who was on the 2005 Santa Barbara Kennel Club catalog cover.

Shona Prebble Shona's entire life has been involved with dogs. In 1960, along with her husband Gavin, she established "Melandar Kennels" which bred and exhibited Pembroke Welsh Corgis and Pekingese. In 1990, she introduced Siberian Huskies into her breeding program. Her Siberians have taken top awards in New Zealand and overseas. She began judging in 1972 and has been approved to judge all-breeds since 1987. Shona is a Life Member and former President of the New Zealand Kennel Club. She is also Patroness of three Specialist Breed Clubs.

Robin Stark Robin has been in love with Keeshonden since 1961 and will never be without one – or several. She helped create the Keeshond "Illustrated Standard" and was a member of the KCA Standard Revision Committee. As a writer and public speaker, Robin has give the most Seminars on the breed to help those wishing to learn what the standard is all about. Interested in Junior Showmanship when her son successfully competed many moons ago, Robin appreciates juniors properly presenting a dog for its breed. Two of her biggest honors were being nominate for Best Owner Handler and judging a Championship Specialty Show in England.

Debra Thornton In 1983, Debbie acquired her first Newfoundland. Over the years, Debbie has bred over 50 Champions. In addition to her Newfies, she also owns, breeds and occasionally shows her Portuguese Water Dogs; the new smaller breed in her life. Actively involved in canine organizations in this country, she is also a founder of the Animal Care Association of Mexico, an organization involved in the rescue and neutering of animals and the education of the public regarding animal care.

Entry is to be made at the same time as entries for the regular class. Sweepstakes and the age division must be marked in the "Additional Classes" space on the official AKC entry form.

2. The Sweepstakes fee is \$10.00 plus the entry of the Regular Class

3. Classes (divided by sex): 6 & under 9 months; 9 & under 12 months; 12 & under 18 months; 18 & under 24 months

The four dog classes will be judged in the above order, followed by the four bitch classes. Winners of the eight classes will then compete for Best in Sweepstakes and Best of Opposite Sex To Best in Sweepstakes.

4. The division of prize money: after 30% has been deducted by the club to defray Sweepstakes expenses, the remainder of the entry fees will be awarded as follows:

JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP COMPETITION

Novice Junior Class: For Boys and Girls who are at least 9 years old and under 12 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have not won three First Place awards with competition present in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Novice Intermediate Class: For Boys and Girls who are at least 12 years old and under 15 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have not won three First Place awards with competition present in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Novice Senior Class: For Boys and Girls who are at least 15 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have not won three First Place awards with competition present in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Open Junior Class: For Boys and Girls who are at least 9 years old and under 12 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have won three First Place awards with competition present in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Open Intermediate Class: For Boys and Girls who are at least 12 years old and under 15 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have won three First Place awards with competition present in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Open Senior Class: For Boys and Girls who are at least 15 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have won three First Place awards with competition present in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Each dog handled in a Junior Showmanship Class must be entered in one of the Breed or Obedience Classes at the show, or must be entered for Junior Showmanship only. However, a dog may be substituted. Such substitution must be accompanied by an official AKC entry form. All such substitutions must be made one half-hour prior to the judging of any Junior Showmanship Classes at the show. Each dog must be owned or co-owned by the Junior Handler or by the Junior Handler's father, mother, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, grandfather or grandmother, including step and half relations or by a member of the Junior Handler's household. Every dog entered for Junior Showmanship must be eligible to compete in Dog Shows or in Obedience Trials. BITCHES IN SEASON ARE NOT ELIGIBLE. A dog that has been excused or disqualified by a Breed Judge or by a Bench Show Committee may still be handled in Junior Showmanship if eligible to compete in Obedience Trials. A dog that has been rejected, dismissed, or excused by the Veterinarian for the protection of the other dogs at the show or for the protection of the dog excused may not be handled in Junior Showmanship.

Junior Handlers who win a third Novice Class with competition present after the closing of entries for a show may transfer their entry from the Novice Class to the Open Class provided that this transfer is made by the Superintendent at least one half-hour prior to the scheduled start of any regular conformation judging or one half-hour prior to the scheduled start of Junior Showmanship judging at the show, whichever is earlier.

Winning of first place in an Open Class at this show may qualify or count toward qualification for entry in certain future limited Junior Showmanship Classes. For information on eligibility requirements for limited Junior Showmanship Classes which have been approved to date by AKC, write to the American Kennel Club, 5580 Centerville Drive #200, Raleigh, NC 27606.

Junior Handler's must include their AKC Junior Handler identification number on the entry blank.

The Kennel Club is not responsible for the actions or products of the commercial vendors at this show. This show may be televised.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

The Santa Barbara Kennel Club Dog Show will be heavily patrolled by authorized officers of the Humane Society. Exhibitors and visitors must not leave dogs in inadequately ventilated vehicles. Under California law, it is a misdemeanor to permit an animal to be subjected to unnecessary suffering or cruelty or to be deprived of necessary care, sustenance, drink or shelter. Violators of these provisions of law will be issued citations and are subject to prosecution.

ADDITIONAL RULES

1. Entries must reach the Superintendent, Jack Bradshaw, 5434 East Olympic Boulevard, Los Angeles CA, 90022, by Noon, Wednesday August 6, 2008 PDT. Fees should accompany entries. This club and/or its superintendent assumes no responsibility for wrong or incomplete information given on the entry blank by the owner or agent of the owner. This club and its superintendents assume no responsibility for the owner or owner's agents entering a dog in a class in which the dog is not eligible to compete, or for entering the same dog twice.
2. Returned Checks do not constitute a valid entry fee. The Superintendent will add a collection fee to the amount of each returned check and declined credit card. Subsequent returned checks for the same exhibitors may result in their being put on a CASH ONLY basis. The returned check or declined credit card MUST BE MADE GOOD by cash or money order BEFORE the dog will be allowed in the ring.
3. Exhibitors' Identification tickets and judging programs will be mailed to the address given on the entry blank. If not received within a reasonable time prior to the show, notify the superintendent. Tickets returned by the Post Office marked 'undeliverable' will be held at the Superintendent's Office. PLEASE BRING YOUR IDENTIFICATION TICKETS TO THE SHOW.
4. During the hours of judging owners are to be on call, and have their dogs ready to bring into the judging ring promptly. In order that the judging will not be delayed. Dogs need only be present for their judging. Dogs not needed for further judging may be excused. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have his dog ready to be shown and at the entrance of the judging ring when the steward calls for the class. Owners of dogs or the handlers of the dogs alone are responsible for the presence of their dogs in the judging rings. This means it is not the responsibility of the ring steward, nor of any agent of the show-giving club to locate any dog, its owner or handler, when the dog's presence is needed in a judging ring. It should be understood by every exhibitor and handler that waiting for dogs to be brought into the ring is a courtesy extended to the owner or handler of the dog. There is no rule of this club nor of The American Kennel Club that requires a judge to wait for an owner or handler to bring his dog into the ring. Show hours 7 a.m. to 11:30 p.m.
5. Trophies and prizes will be awarded in the judging ring before the completion of the judging of the breed and the superintendent's office advised at once, in the event of any discrepancy. All trophies must be claimed the day of the show. None will be mailed.
6. Exhibitors are admonished to make themselves familiar with the agreement of the American Kennel Club, referred to on the reverse side of the entry blanks that accompany this premium list. Rule books are available at the Superintendent's table at the shows or may be obtained from the A.K.C., 5580 Centerview Drive #200, Raleigh, NC 27606.
7. The club, its superintendents or their employees will not be responsible for the loss of or damage to any dog exhibited, whether the result of accident or other causes and in addition assumes no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by an exhibitor or handler. It is distinctly understood that every dog at this show is in the care and custody and control of his owner or handler during the entire time the dog is on the show premises.
8. No grooming tables, pens or exhibitors setups will be allowed in the aisles and all grooming must be done away from the judging ring in areas specified by the club.
9. Entry fees shall NOT be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, sick, lame, excused by veterinarian or judge, barred from competition by action of the Bench Show Committee, or because the dog is ineligible to compete due to being entered incorrectly. There is no refund of entry fee for duplicate entry. There will be a \$2.00 fee charged for cancellation of entry prior to closing of entries.
10. There is no provision offered for unentered dogs at this show.
11. Declination of Entries. The Santa Barbara Kennel Club may decline any entries for cause and may refuse to receive or may remove any dog on account of disease, viciousness or other causes, and no one shall have any claim or recourse against the Kennel Club or any official thereof.
12. If, because of riots, civil disturbances or other acts beyond the control of the management, it is impossible to open or complete the show, no refund of entry will be made.
13. Do not leave any dogs in closed vehicles.
14. A Recording Fee of 50 cents, an Event Services Fee of \$3.00 and a \$3.00 rally fee will be required at any Licensed or Member Club Show, Obedience Trial or Tracking Test. These fees are to be collected by the Show-giving Club and paid to the American Kennel Club. (American Kennel Club Rule, Chapter 11, Section 2.)
15. Dogs which according to their owners' records have completed the requirements for a championship after the closing of entries for the show but whose championships are unconfirmed, may be transferred from one of the regular classes to the Best of Breed or Variety Competition, provided this transfer is made by the Superintendent at least one half hour prior to the start of the earliest Conformation judging at the Show.
16. Junior Handlers who win a third Novice Class after the Closing of entries for a show may transfer their entry from the Novice Class to the Open Class provided that this transfer is made by the Superintendent at least one half-hour prior to the scheduled start of the earliest conformation judging or one half-hour prior to the scheduled start of Junior Showmanship judging at the Show, whichever is earlier.
17. No set-ups within 20 feet of any ring.
18. Dogs which according to their owners' records have earned an obedience or rally title after the closing of entries for the show may be moved up to the next class, provided this transfer is made in writing and presented to the superintendent at least 30 minutes prior to the start of each trial.
19. Practicing is not allowed in rings at any time.
